

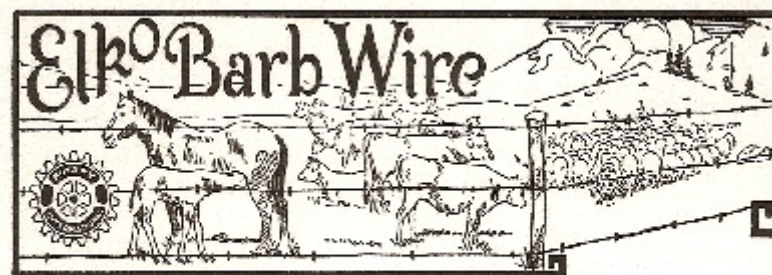
Propose a new member!
